**"Marshfield Clinic
Occupies New Office"**

New Year's day was a busy one for Drs. K. W. Doege, V. A. Mason, H. H. Milbee, William Hipke, R. P. Potter and W. G. Sexton, who have associated themselves together in an incorporated partnership under the firm name of the Marshfield Clinic. On that day they removed from their old offices to the new quarters, which comprise the entire second floor of the Thiel block. A. Morgan Chase, the business manager, opened the new filing system and records the same day and a staff of competent assistants also began their work in the new surroundings. Not all of the interior work has been done in the building, owing to the failure of steel and iron ... to arrive, but the lack of a few finishing touches will not hinder the business of work. A private telephone system unites the several rooms and three trunk lines have been installed to give prompt service to each office over the Marshfield Telephone exchange lines."
