WORKSHOP SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

B	Morgue Tour WARNING: graphic images/content! What types of deaths must be reported to the coroner in Wisconsin? What is the purpose of an autopsy and when are autopsies least likely to provide useful information? Find out the answers to these questions plus the history of autopsies, procedures, and various findings, not to mention, a tour of the actual Marshfield Medical Center's morgue. Max Capacity: 15
C	Robotics in Healthcare The daVinci® Xi Surgical System is an advanced robotic system designed to expand surgeon's capabilities to provide minimally invasive options for hysterectomy, prostatectomy, nephrectomy, cystectomy, adrenalectomy, thoracotomy, cholecystectomy, hernia repair, bowel resection, bariatric surgery and more. This daVinci® system features a magnified 3D high-definition vision system and tiny wristed instruments that bend and rotate far greater than the human wrist, yet the surgeon is 100% in control of the system. All this coupled with FireFly (Fluorescence Imaging) capabilities make this system a state-of-the-art option for extremely precise surgery. Interact with this cutting-edge technology to get a glimpse of a surgeon's role. Max Capacity: 10-15
D	Radiology Curious on what a Radiologic Technologist does? This session will provide background on the profession, including what jobs a person could have. Learners will have a hands-on learning experience with equipment and participate in a game to guess what the reading is on each x-ray and the modality it is from. Max Capacity: 10
E	Simulation Lab The Simulation Lab will display various types of simulation trainers. Learners will have a hands-on learning experience with high fidelity mannequins, high tech simulators. These simulators assist providers with learning patient care skills and now you can learn more about these tools. Please join us for some hands-on training experiences! Max Capacity: 15-20
F	Pharmacy Experience Wondering what happens in pharmacy? This session will provide background on the pharmacy profession. You will observe the steps involved in preparing a prescription or medication order, including the stages the pharmacist takes in verifying the accuracy (e.g., dose, drug interactions). Curious about compounding or preparing medications? This is your opportunity to observe a pharmacist compound a prescription product and prepare a medication for administration. Max Capacity: 10
G	What is Histology and Why Should We Care? Ever wonder what happens in the lab after a biopsy is taken? This workshop will provide a hands-on experience with embedding and staining tissues to slides. There will be a demonstration on how to properly cut a tissue block as well as a tour of the Histology lab with an overview of the different areas. Required Dress Code (per OSHA guidelines): <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Appropriate footwear is required. High-heels, open-toed shoes, sandals, and flip-flops are NOT allowed. Non-slip soles are recommended, tennis shoes are best.2. Stockings must be worn; legs must be covered below pant/skirt hemlines. Shorts are NOT allowed.3.
