- _____ **Surgical Intensive Care Unit (SICU)**
SICU is an 18-bed, adult unit serving the following patients: open heart recovery, neurosurgery, trauma, general surgery and continuous renal replacement therapy.
- _____ **Medical Intensive Care Unit (MICU)**
MICU is a 16-bed, adult unit serving the following patients: MI/thrombolytic, CHF, cardiogenic shock, arrhythmias, acute respiratory failure, pneumonia, GI bleed, renal, inner cool, continuous renal replacement therapy, sepsis or any other acute medical conditions requiring intensive care.
- _____ **Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU)**
PICU is an 8-bed, pediatric unit with patients ranging in age from infants through 18 years and serving (including but not limited to) trauma, medical/surgical, cardiac, neuro, hematology/oncology and ortho.
- X** _____ **Post Anesthesia Care Unit (PACU) – No open positions July 2019 class**
PACU is an adult/pediatric unit focusing on pre-admission and recovery admission of all surgical and procedure patients to include myelograms, ERCP and postop care for those patients. Procedures performed in the unit include bronchoscopy, TEEs, pain, cardiovascular, ECT. Recovery of all surgical patients including general surgery, ortho, neuro, thoracic and EENT are also served on this unit.
- _____ **Emergency Department (ED)**
ED is a 20-bed adult/pediatric, level II trauma center and will see a variety of patients of all age groups. The ED has an annual census of 20,000 patients per year.
- _____ **Adult Critical Care Float Pool (A-CCFP)**
A position in our A-CCFP brings the excitement of being part of a team of versatile and essential resources for our adult medical and surgical intensive care units. Candidates need to possess exceptional basic nursing skills, a strong desire for on-going learning, and an ability to be flexible and adapt to rapid changes including unit assignments. As a float pool team member, the candidates will get experience in both adult critical care units. They will orient and staff both surgical and medical ICUs. In the future, to meet the float pool minimum 3-unit rule, they will choose an additional unit to orient to.
- _____ **Children's Hospital Critical Care Float Pool (C-CCFP)**
Our Critical Care Nurse Residency Program offers the graduate nurse a unique opportunity within our Children's Hospital to take their skills, knowledge and critical thinking to the next level. A float pool nurse position brings the excitement of being part of a team of versatile and essential resources for our Children's Hospital pediatrics, pediatric ICU and neonatal ICU units. Candidates need to possess exceptional basic nursing skills, a strong desire for on-going learning, and an ability to be flexible and adapt to rapid changes including unit assignments. The candidates will orient and staff both pediatrics and PICU. In the future, they will orient and staff in the neonatal ICU.
