



OVERVIEW – Central Wisconsin Partnership for Recovery

The **Central Wisconsin Partnership for Recovery (CWPR)**, formed in 2019, is a consortium of more than 44 members from at least 24 different organizations, who have come together with the *mission* to create awareness and work together to reduce the prevalence of substance use disorders through prevention, treatment and recovery programming for all residents living in Clark and Wood Counties. The full CWPR meets every other month.

CWPR’s four priority areas are:

Targeted Youth Intervention

Jail Discharge Planner

Safe and Sober Housing

Peer Recovery Support

<p>Provide substance use disorder prevention/ intervention resources to school districts and agencies in Clark and Wood County. A Youth Programming workgroup meets monthly.</p> <p><i>Activities include:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hire, train, and sustain School Resource Officer (SRO), who will be employed by Clark County Sheriff’s Office • Train SROs and/or other school district staff to use a standardized curriculum for youth substance use disorder prevention • Share information regarding the Wood County Youth Diversion Program 	<p>Support the Jail Discharge Planner employed at Wood County Human Services in partnership with the Wood County Sheriff’s Department to serve justice-involved individuals and support engagement in treatment and recovery support services upon release from incarceration.</p> <p><i>Activities include:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hire, train, and sustain Jail Discharge Planner for Wood County • Establish Jail Discharge Planner evaluation plan 	<p>Working to implement an adapted version of the Hunger & Poverty Prevention Partnership of Portage County RentReady Program to support individuals in sustained recovery from substance use disorder with housing opportunities. A Safe and Sober Housing workgroup meets monthly.</p> <p><i>Activities include:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify local RentReady program champions and landlords willing to rent to individuals in substance use disorder recovery • Establish a pool of funds for adapted RentReady program to support rental guarantees, vouchers, and deposits 	<p>Expand access to peer support professionals with lived experience in recovery from substance use disorders. Provide supportive services and increase recovery support in the workplace through the Recovery Supportive Workplace program. The Peer Support workgroup meets monthly.</p> <p><i>Activities include:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partner with businesses to support recovery supportive workplace initiatives • Partner with community agencies to implement expanded peer recovery support (e.g., peer specialist and recovery coaches)
